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MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN DONALD A. COLLINS, JR.

FAIR's mission continues to be about helping Americans understand the costs and consequences of mass immigration for the nation's future and empowering them in their communities.

In no better way was this accomplished than in 2014. Against the odds and the predictions of every pundit in America, through our research, public education, community outreach, and government relations programs, FAIR and its members were able to derail the Senate Gang of Eight's disastrous "comprehensive immigration reform" bill—a bill that would double legal immigration over the next decade and hand amnesty to between 11-12 million illegal aliens.

This victory was ultimately short lived.

President Obama made an end-run around Congress and the will of the American people with amnesty by executive fiat after the November elections. The president's contempt for the voters, Congress, the rule of law, and the duties of his office as he moves forward in his "fundamental transformation" of America is astounding.

Today, immigration to America is at an all-time high. Driven by the "chain migration" that was the unforeseen consequence of the 1965 Immigration Act—abetted by President Obama's amnesties, executive fiats and lax enforcement policies—more than one million new immigrants settle here permanently each year. Most are unskilled and poorly educated.

Without significant changes in U.S. immigration policy, the numbers are almost certain to rise, given demographic realities in much of the developing world and the special interest agendas that seek financial or political gain from mass immigration.

The continued political destabilization in the Middle East is beginning to create a flood of refugees or migrants fleeing to other countries. There needs to be a voice of reason speaking out about the facts of this situation: the numbers, the review process, the dangers of terrorists using this crisis to enter target countries. FAIR will continue to educate the media and the public on this disaster and work towards more reasonable solutions.

Unfettered immigration is having very real impacts today on many areas of national concern including homeland security, educational excellence, the perpetuation of poverty and government dependency, erosion of our middle class, and many others. These impacts will become even more profound over time if immigration continues at its present rate.

Undoubtedly 2015 will be a year dedicated to undoing damage and preventing more unilateral actions from the Obama administration. FAIR will continue to be a beacon of light in these new, uncharted and dangerous waters.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT **DAN STEIN**

This may be the end of the age of mass migration, and Europe may be rising up in opposition to continued inflows, but this administration missed the memo.

America's immigration control system has now collapsed. It no longer functions and the rule of law no longer prevails. The Obama administration is acting illegally in providing work authorization and public benefits to millions of illegal aliens, while it releases both criminal and otherwise illegal aliens without regard to the rigorous requirements of immigration law. The administration is purposely thwarting all the efforts of Congress these past twenty years to restrain the use of parole, "deferred action," and administrative discretion.

What we've fought for decades to prevent has now happened, and it has been the unmistakable objective of the current administration to bring this about. Eight hundred million Americans by 2100 may soon be a mid-range estimate. Already the seeds have been planted to raise annual immigration levels well beyond 2 million a year with no end in sight.

What our nation needs is leadership.

FAIR is working to lead as a people's lobby. We made enormous strides in 2014 to limit damages from executive expansion of immigration while making strides in influencing the conversation across America, from the Capitol to local communities.

For the first time in two years, we had the chance to take a proactive role in shaping good legislation in the House, including a bill specifically limiting

the president from expanding his Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) amnesty. This legislation, of course, was not taken up by the Senate, but was a positive reinforcement for true reformers that there is hope for progress in the new Congress. FAIR was the first place legislators looked to when the Central American border surge hit. We were able to propose meaningful changes to close the loophole drawing minors to cross the desert. Of course, the biggest magnet still remains, a president willing to grant amnesty to classes of illegal aliens at his will without review by Congress.

In light of the border crisis, President Obama decided to delay the announcement of his 2nd executive amnesty—Deferred Action for Parents of Americans (DAPA) and expansion of DACA—until after the November election. This was a huge victory for FAIR. Here the elite consensus began to fall apart and it became clear that the potential voter revolt could cost Democrats control of the Senate. FAIR played an important role in questioning the legality of this action, and other voices joined in to explain that this executive over-reach was a political disaster for the White House.

When President Obama announced his amnesty expansion after nearly nine months of delay, it was met with extreme scrutiny after the Republicans swept the mid-term elections. This paved the ground for a lawsuit which will play out in 2015. FAIR will be there providing strategic leadership as well as an informed perspective for the media and the American public.

The nation's ability to deter illegal immigration and to see the laws enacted by Congress respected and enforced is seriously in jeopardy. Never has our work been more urgent, and never has the need been greater for effective leadership and a firm hand at the wheel.



F AIR's work over the past two years has significantly enriched the public dialogue on immigration issues. The increased awareness was clearly demonstrated in our challenge to the policy assumptions underlying the effort in the 113th Congress to pass a massive immigration increase bill and was further borne out in the debates of the 2014 elections and in exit polling.

Challenging as these last two years have been—and they have been very challenging, thanks to the multi-million dollar coalition of political extremists bent on amnesty, anti-borders, and cheap labor—they have brought immigration to the fore as an important national issue and one that Americans care about.

FAIR's experience and knowledge, our reputation, and our prominence in the public dialogue will serve the nation well as we move forward.

RESEARCH & PUBLICATIONS

FAIR's research projects have been largely concerned with the costs of proposed immigration overhauls and their effects on employment prospects for Americans. Our timely, relevant, and balanced research reports produced online and in print have included:

The Fiscal Burden of Illegal Immigration on Texans Texas spends over \$12.1 billion a year providing education, health care, social, and government services to illegal aliens and their dependents. This report educated Texans about the immense costs of illegal immigration on Texans as they consider their own legislation as well as advise federal government policies in their capacity as a border state.

Generation Jobless: the Unemployment Crisis of Millennials The Millennial Generation is on its way to becoming a “lost generation” as many

politicians continue to push for amnesty and massive increases in immigration levels, putting the special interests of a narrow economic and political elite above the needs of this generation dealing with the economic realities of joining the labor force during a recession.

The Fiscal Burden of Illegal Immigration on North Carolinians North Carolina is an example of how illegal immigration affects non-border states, costing North Carolina taxpayers about \$2 billion a year. This is important information for North Carolinians as the state considers its policy on illegal immigration, as well as other non-border states that haven't considered the fiscal impacts of illegal immigration to the interior.

The (Il)Logic of Open-Border Libertarians As Libertarianism gains traction in the political mainstream, especially among millennials, this report makes the case that the unregulated, free flow of labor is not a core component of libertarianism, and in practice would undermine more core libertarian principles of economic liberty and low regulation.

The Fiscal Burden of Illegal Immigration on California Taxpayers California is a misguided leader among states in providing incentives that encourage high levels of illegal immigration. As California debated state-wide anti-cooperation laws with federal immigration enforcement, FAIR produced this report to educate Californians on the immense fiscal burden of providing for the current illegal immigration population at a cost over \$25 billion a year.

Estimated Cost of K-12 Public Education for Unaccompanied Alien Children In response to the unaccompanied alien minor crisis of 2014, FAIR put together this report educating the public on what the U.S. provides for illegal alien children and estimating the additional costs, totaling \$761.4 million nationwide, as a result of this crisis. Not only

were we able to point to the Obama administration's role in creating this crisis, but to explain the fiscal costs as well.

President Obama's Record of Dismantling Immigration Enforcement As the Obama Administration continued to carry out a policy of de facto amnesty for millions of illegal aliens through executive policy decisions, we updated our report. This comprehensive report detailing all the steps taken to systematically gut effective immigration enforcement policies has been used to publicize to the American people the sheer number of steps taken that have gone largely unreported, and is an excellent resource to the media and public officials.


IN THE MEDIA

FAIR is America's and the media's source for reliable information and perspective on immigration issues at all levels. This year was no exception. Our expertise was sought for commentary and solutions on the unaccompanied illegal alien minor crisis, the expansion of President Obama's Deferred Action amnesty program, the failure of the Senate's amnesty bill to pass in the 113th Congress, as well as a host of other issues including refugee, asylum, advance parole, and more.

FAIR was called on by the media nearly 900 times in 2014, from television networks to newspapers, and online. Among the news outlets who sought our comments were NBC, CBS, CNBC, CNN, MSNBC, Fox News, Univision, the BBC, New York Times, Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Washington Times, Boston Globe, Christian Science Monitor, Economist, Fortune, Huffington Post, Bloomberg, Telemundo, Voice of America, and many others.

On the airwaves
FAIR's annual Hold Their Feet to the Fire radio row was held on Capitol Hill here in Washington on April 9th and 10th, bringing together 50 national and local radio talk show hosts, broadcasting to listeners in all 50 states. Featuring over 300 hours of live radio focused on challenges in U.S. immigration policy, and continuous interviews with leading immigration policy experts, members of Congress, and law enforcement officials, this event figures prominently





in the national immigration debate. Last year's Hold Their Feet to the Fire was an important factor in the ultimate demise of the Senate Gang of Eight's disastrous immigration bill. This extraordinary event reaches millions, and is widely viewed as unique in the area of American public policy.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Victory in Oregon

Oregonians, aided by FAIR, achieved a monumental state-wide victory in a referendum to overturn legislation passed in 2013 that would hand driver's licenses to illegal immigrants. On November 4, 2014, Oregon voters decided by a margin of 66 to 33 to cancel that law—by means of a ballot initiative drafted with FAIR's assistance on behalf of Oregonians for Immigration Reform. This measure received more votes than any other issue or candidate on the ballot. As a reliably "blue" state, this victory in Oregon shows that concerns about illegal immigration cross party lines, and is a prime example of the power of local activism in the immigration debate.

Our friends, the sheriffs

As the Obama administration continues to erode the rule of immigration law, law enforcement is increasingly standing up in protest—and sheriffs are making the biggest splash. Unlike political appointees, sheriffs are elected and held accountable by their constituents. This fact, along with their keen awareness of crime and law enforcement costs in their counties, has made sheriffs natural allies in this fight and leaders in the law enforcement community.

When the unaccompanied minor border surge was at its peak, FAIR organized a border trip for sheriffs to get a firsthand look at the lawlessness on the border. In turn, the sheriffs alerted their constituents and the media alike—with more than 150 television, radio, and newspaper interviews nationwide—about the lawlessness at the border and its impacts on interior states.

From the federal level to state and local governments, FAIR provides valuable institutional knowledge of immigration laws, legal expertise, and strategic leadership to empower legislators interested in creating responsible immigration policy in the national interest.

LEGISLATIVE RESOURCE

FAIR's federal legislative experts provided legislative summaries for all immigration legislation in 2014 and frequently advised members of Congress and hill staffers on steps they can take to reign in the president's executive expansion of immigration. When the border crisis hit, Congressional offices immediately reached out to FAIR for our guidance and expertise, which we gladly offered. Hill staffers and engaged Americans alike rely on FAIR's thoughtful and researched legislative summaries as well as our weekly "Legislative Updates" to keep up-to-date on the ever evolving immigration debate.

State and local governments are increasingly becoming national influencers in the immigration debate. We provide model legislation, bill drafting assistance, research, reports, written testimony for hearings, and legal summaries and analyses. Our work in 2014 primarily focused on preventing illegal aliens from receiving state benefits, such as tuition assistance and driver's licenses, as well as on proactive legislation strengthening workplace enforcement and opposing transfers of unaccompanied minors into communities.

FAIR's immigration policy internship program offers selected college students an in-depth education on immigration issues along with the opportunity to hone valuable professional skills.


