Immigration by the Numbers

Population (2012 Census Bureau estimate)	19,570,261
Illegal Alien Population (2010 FAIR estimate)	750,000
Cost of Illegal Aliens (2010 FAIR estimate)	\$9,479,000,000
Projected Population 2050 (2006 FAIR estimate)	26,157,100
Unemployment Rate (BLS estimate, Nov 2012)	8.3%

Cost to New Yorkers

\$9.5 billion a year spent on illegal immigration

- \$5.8 billion a year to educate the children of illegal aliens
- \$957 million a year on unreimbursed health care for illegal aliens
- \$865 million a year on criminal justice activities for illegal aliens
- \$648 million a year on welfare for illegal aliens
- \$1.2 billion a year for additional state/local operating costs
- \$1,607 annual cost to each of New York's native-born headed households
